DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in Breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Awards each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of special wins, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. WEDNESDAY, 26th FEBRUARY, 2015. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

- (1) WITHDRAWAL: The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(i) and 20.
 - (2) TRANSFER: a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class or Puppy class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age or eighteen calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class or the Junior class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy class or Junior class, to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING: For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show

MAIDEN: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or a First Prize at an Open or Championship Show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

NOVICE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, and Open classes, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

POST GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT: For dogs which have not won three Challenge Certificates under three different Judges or seven or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN: For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN: For dogs of seven years of age and over on the first day of the Show.

SPECIAL BEGINNERS: For dogs owned by exhibitors whose dogs have not won a Challenge Certificate in the Breed. The qualification applies to the EXHIBITOR and NOT the dog.

NOT FOR COMPETITION: For dogs of any breed, over the age of four calendar months, belonging to exhibitors who wish to have them at the Show. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded 'NFC' on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered. The declaration form must be signed.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 09.00 a.m.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 10.00 a.m.

4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed.
5. The Show will be moved in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
6. **ENTRY FEES:** Members £8.00 for First Entry For Each Dog; £2.00 Each Subsequent Entry For Each Dog. Non Members £10.00 For First Entry For Each Dog; £3.00 Each Subsequent Entry For Each Dog. Not for Competition £2.00. Catalogues £2.00
7. **PRIZE MONEY:** The amount of money on offer in this show is £40 for Best in Show, £20 for Best Opposite Sex, £10 for Reserve Best in Show. No class prize money.
8. **Time:** No class prize money.

9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.

10. The names of bitches within the precincts of the Show is strictly prohibited.
11. Best Puppy in Show (if scheduled) Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has completed and is by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six, and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show.
12. The Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unobtain by any other puppy.
13. Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show will follow the selection of Best in Show respectively.

14. Puppies in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unobtain by any other puppy.
15. Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than Breed Classes prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show. Puppies which are appropriate, order to remain unobtain by any other puppy in competition for Best Puppy in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.
16. Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than Breed Classes prior to the competition for Best in Show. Puppies which are appropriate, order to remain unobtain by any other dog in competition for Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.

17. Proviso: For the purposes of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.

18. Award of First in Show is a dog which has competed and is unobtain by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. A dog which has completed and is by any other dog exhibited at the same Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.

19. Withdrawal from Other Competition.

Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than breed classes prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unobtain. A dog declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.
20. Proviso: For the purposes of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.

21. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the commencement of the exhibit is required for judging; and they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being allowed on time, and then only with the permission of the Show Management.
22. No modifications will be made to this Schedule, except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.

23. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Amex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
24. All dogs resident outside the U.K. must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show / event.

25. **DOGS IN CARE ON HOT DAYS:** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help you through the dog's don't and travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events. When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams. If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all. The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of dogs should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
26. When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
27. Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
28. Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.
29. Remember, if you feel that your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look for shade and water for your dog. If you are unsure, please contact your local Kennel Club for more information.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event must take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations, Right to Refuse Entries, Exhibitors' Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

29. **NOT FOR COMPETITION:** Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.

30. **PREPARATION FOR EXHIBITION:** All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F Amex.B - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
31. **DOG FOULING/GROOMING WASTE:** Any owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove immediately any fouling caused by their dog's faeces, and any grooming waste, at any Kennel Club Licensed Show and within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event, including car and caravan parks and approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be provided.

32. **RESPONSIBILITY:** The exhibitor will be most anxious for care and safety of all dogs entered for exhibition and for any damage caused to the exhibitor's property or to the property of others. Exhibitors are reminded that they are responsible for any act of omission or partial loss, or detention of, or damage to, dogs or person for any cause whatsoever, nor for any act of omission by themselves, their officers, servants, agents and others, and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
